Thursday Evening. A resolution being introduced in relation to E. P. Lovejoy, murdered at Alton a few years since, his brother Owen P. Lovejoy, was called out.

The senatorial committee reported E. F. Gay, of Livingston Co., as candidate for Senator. The convention unanimously confirmed the nomination.
